The first National Day of Prayer was called for by King George VI on March 27th, 1940. A quarter mile queued to get into Westminster Abbey.



March 23rd, 1941. The guidance of God must have been evident, for we did not know at the time that this was Hitler's next date for invading Britain. However, only three months later June 22nd 1941 Hitler turned towards Russia. He forgot that others had tried and failed like Napoleon as the Russian winters were harsh.



The fifth National Day of Prayer was on September 3rd, 1942. It was the third anniversary of the outbreak of war. The very next day at Palermo in the Mediterranean, the whole Italian fleet was sunk. Very significantly, the next month in the North African desert, the Eighth Army under General Montgomery saved Egypt (and therefore Israel) from being invaded by Hitler's powerful tank commander Rommel.



The sixth National Day of Prayer was held on September 3rd, 1943. It was a weekday, chosen at the time because it was the fourth anniversary of the outbreak of war. Italy surrendered to the allies that very night, and the dictator Mussolini was murdered.



GENERAL EISENHOWER

was the Supreme Commander of the Allied Forces responsible for D Day and the ultimate liberation of Europe. He held a unique position where he knew everything that was going on. In June 1952 as he reflected on the events of D Day he stated,



“This day eight years ago, I made the most agonising decision of my life. I had to decide to postpone by at least 24 hours the most formidable array of fighting ships and of fighting men that was ever launched across the sea against a hostile shore. The consequences of that decision at that moment could not have been foreseen by anyone. If there were nothing else in my life to prove the existence of an Almighty and merciful God, the events of the next 24 hours did it...The greatest break in a terrible outlay of weather occurred the next day and allowed that great invasion to proceed, with losses far below those we had anticipated

In a 1948 speech to the British House of Commons, Winston Churchill said, "Those that fail to learn from history are doomed to repeat it."

Zakhor: To remember, to recall, to call to mind, to mention.

Rosh Hashanah: The Jewish New Year, a time for introspection, prayer, and sounding the shofar (ram's horn).

Yom Kippur: The Day of Atonement, a solemn day of fasting, prayer, and repentance.

Sukkot: A week-long harvest festival commemorating the Israelites' journey through the desert.

Hanukkah: An eight-day festival celebrating the rededication of the Second Temple in Jerusalem.

Purim: A festive holiday celebrating the Jewish people's deliverance from Haman's plot in the Book of Esther.

Passover (Pesach): A major festival commemorating the Israelites' exodus from slavery in Egypt.

Shavuot: The festival of Weeks, celebrating the giving of the Torah to Moses on Mount Sinai.

LEVITICUS 26:45 (NKJV)

But for their sake I will remember the covenant with their ancestors whom I brought out of Egypt in the sight of the nations to be their God. I am the Lord.


THE FOUR CUPS OF WINE REPRESENT FOUR PROMISES MADE TO ISRAEL:

1. The first cup of wine is called **THE CUP OF SANCTIFICATION**. It is to commemorate the promise: "I will bring you out."
2. The second cup is called **THE CUP OF PLAGUES**. It reflects the plagues that came upon Egypt – and it relates to the second promise: "I will free you from being slaves."
3. The third cup is called **THE CUP OF REDEMPTION**. God says: "I will redeem you."
4. The fourth cup is called **THE CUP OF COMPLETION**. God says: "I will take you as my own people."



1. The first cup of wine is called **THE CUP OF SANCTIFICATION**. It is to commemorate the promise: "I will bring you out."

LUKE 22:17 (NKJV) And when He had taken a cup and given thanks, He said, "Take this and share it among yourselves."



ISAIAH 53:5 (NIV)

He was pierced for our transgressions, He was bruised for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was upon Him, and by His stripes we are healed."



STRIPED because it is by His stripes we are healed
(ISAIAH 53:5)

PIERCED Because his hands and feet were pierced by nails. His side was pierced by a soldier's spear (JOHN 19:34) and His brow pierced by a crown of thorns (JOHN 19:2)

BURNT Because the fire of God's judgment fell upon Him when He carried our sins (ISAIAH 53:4)



MARK 10:15 (NLT)

I tell you the truth, anyone who will not receive the Kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it." Childlike faith and trust is the way to God.



MATTHEW 26:26 (NLT)

As they were eating, Jesus took some bread and blessed it. Then he broke it in pieces and gave it to the disciples, saying, “Take this and eat it, for this is my body.”

The third cup is called **THE CUP OF REDEMPTION**

God says: "I will redeem you."



LUKE 22:20 (NLT)

After supper he took another cup of wine and said, "This cup is the new covenant between God and his people—an agreement confirmed with my blood, which is poured out as a sacrifice for you

MATTHEW 26:27-28(NLT)

He took a cup of wine and gave thanks to God for it. He gave it to them and said, "Each of you drink from it, for this is my blood, which confirms the covenant-between God and his people. It is poured out as a sacrifice to forgive the sins of many.

4. The fourth cup is called **THE CUP OF COMPLETION**
God says: "I will take you as my own people."



MATTHEW 26:29 (NLT) "Mark my words—I will not drink wine again until the day I drink it new with you in my Father's Kingdom."

MATTHEW 26:30 (NLT) Then they sang a hymn and went out to the Mount of Olives.

PSALM 118

is one of the great Messianic passages in the Old Testament. It contains the following prophetic verses:

14. "The Lord is my strength and my song; He has become my salvation."

ACTS 20:7(NIV)

On the first day of the week, we came together to break bread. Paul spoke to the people and, because he intended to leave the next day, kept on talking until midnight.

Even though Paul was the guest speaker that weekend the purpose of the meeting was to break bread.

ISAIAH 53:3-5 (YLT). (best literal translation.) He is despised, and left of men, A man of pains, and acquainted with sickness, and as one hiding the face from us, He is despised, and we esteemed him not. Surely our sicknesses (choli) he hath borne, and our pains (makov) -- he hath carried them, And we -- we have esteemed him plagued, Smitten of God, and afflicted. And he is pierced for our transgressions, bruised for our iniquities, The chastisement of our peace [is] on him, and by his bruise there is healing to us.

ISAIAH 53:4 (NASB) surely our griefs (choli-sickness) He Himself bore and our sorrows (makov-pain) He carried

MATTHEW 8:17(NKJV) When evening had come, they brought to Him many who were demon-possessed. And He cast out the spirits with a word, and healed all who were sick, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by Isaiah the prophet, saying:
“He Himself took our infirmities
And bore *our* sicknesses.”

1 CORINTHIANS 11:27-30 (NKJV)

Therefore, whoever eats this bread or drinks *this* cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of the body and blood of the Lord. But let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of the bread and drink of the cup. For he who eats and drinks in an unworthy manner eats and drinks judgment to himself, not **discerning** (**diakrinos**) the Lord's body. For this reason, many are weak and sick among you, and many sleep.

(YLT) Surely our sicknesses he hath borne, and our pains -- he hath carried them, And we -- we have esteemed him plagued, smitten of God, and afflicted.

1 CORINTHIANS 11:24-25 (NKJV)

and when He had given thanks, He broke it and said, "Take, eat; this is My body which is broken for you; do this in remembrance of Me."

2 CORINTHIANS 5:21(NKJV)

For He made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us,
that we might become the righteousness of God in
